The Friends Memorial Butterfly Garden of Hidden Valley Camp

was first **dedicated in June, 2000.** Planted entirely with native wildflowers, grasses, and shrubs, the garden has served many purposes:

- benefits our native wildlife friends, particularly birds and butterflies
- provides educational hands-on experiences as youth explore and study the flowers and insects
- serves as a sensory garden, full of texture, color, size, fragrance, and even sound
- the Honored Friends Bench in the center of the garden recognizes living volunteers that have made an impact
- provides a tranquil setting for reflective thinking and enjoyment in a peaceful, natural setting

Memorial Pathway Honoring our Past

Ten years later, The Memorial Brick Pathway was created within the garden to connect us to our past and a place to learn about our history and the legacy of our volunteers of Hidden Valley Camp. Each inscribed brick serves as a link from the past to the present and to the future, as we continue to add the names of our most significant contributors and volunteers. Dedicated during Day Camp on June 16, 2011, the following excerpts of a reading say it all:

"...think of Hidden Valley as a flowering Daisy. The stems, strong and holding everything upright, are like the buildings and roads.

The green leaves, which gather and distribute energy from the sun, are like today's volunteers, as they work to make sure there is enough food, energy and equipment for the girls to enjoy.

The flowers are the girls, bright and dancing in the sun. They are our future, they hold the seeds.

There is another part of the plant you cannot see; it is our past. The roots of the daisy are like those volunteers who built this place, raised funds and spent endless hours working to make sure you have what you need. Their work is now done, and they have passed on, but it is by their caring and their efforts that we are sustained today. We need all the parts of the daisy plant. It is through the dedication of the Brick Memorial Pathway that we may honor and remember our roots, where we came from."
